BICYCLE AND TRAIL ADVISORY COMMITTEE

<u>CREATING AUTHORITY:</u> Adopted on September 24, 2003 by Resolution No. 2003-87. Resolution 2003-87 amended on May 12, 2010 by Resolution 2010-33, amended on August 11, 2010 by Resolution 2010-64.

MEMBERS: The committee shall consist of a member of the City Council who shall also serve as its chair, along with eight members of the public, with recommendations from the city council to be made to the Mayor, and who will appoint the committee with a balance of recreational, commuter, biking, pedestrian, youth and neighborhood group users with the usual Council approval. The Chair may appoint subcommittees, as needed, to study in-depth the respondibilities assigned to the Committee and to present such information to the Committee. The subcommittees shall be made up of nor more than four members of the committee and three interested members of the public. The subcommittees shall engage solely in investigatinh and assembling facts for the Committee, shall only be advisory in nature and shall not formulate public policy on behalf of the Committee.

TERMS: Beginning with the adoption of this resolution, four of the members shall be appointed for one year terms and five shall be appointed for two year terms. Subsequent terms shall be for two years to maintain staggering of terms. There is no limitation to reappointment. The members shall serve at the pleasure of the governing body and may be removed at any time with or without cause.

<u>VACANCIES:</u> Vacancies shall be filled in the same manner as initial appointments and shall be for the remainder of the term. Vacancies shall be filled as to maintain the balance of interest group representation.

<u>MEETING TIMES:</u> A quorum shall be at least five members. The Committee shall also conduct all meetings in accordance with the adopted City policies and procedures and shall use *Robert's Rules of Order* in conducting meetings. They shall meet monthly.

<u>PURPOSE:</u> The purpose of the Bicycle and Trails Advisory Committee is to assure implementation of the city's plan and policies related to bicycle and pedestrian trails and to advise the Governing Body on such matters.

- (b) Review all phases of the projects' design and construction;

- (c) Advise on policies, programs and ordinances as they relate to bicycle and pedestrian trail safety, design and construction;
- (d) Organize media and educational campaigns to provide information and promote bicycle and pedestrian trail related activities and education;
- (e) Work with other agencies for the enhancement of city and county trail systems;
- (f) Review and recommend Parks Master Plan updates related to trails;
- (g) Seek fundingfrom city, state and federal sources;
- (h) Pursue designation of the city of Santa Fe as a bicycle friendly city; and
- (i) Advise on policies, projects, ordinances and funding as they relate to cycling and pedestrians as safe alternative means of transportation on roads and trails.

A RESOLUTION

CREATING A BICYCLE AND TRAIL ADVISORY COMMITTEE.

WHEREAS, the City Council adopted a Bicycle Master Plan in 1993; and

WHEREAS, thousands of Santa Feans enjoy the resulting Arroyo Chamisa Trail and the short segments of the River Trail and Rail Trail for bicycle recreation and commuting; and

WHEREAS, many on street projects for bicycle safety could be accompanied by further on-street improvements; and

WHEREAS, many miles of bicycle trails remain to be completed, including the stretch along the river from Camino Alire to Frenchys Field, the river from St. Francis Drive into downtown to Camino Cabra, the Accquia Madre Trail, the rail trail from Siringo to the Railyard, extension of the trails to the Santa Fe Community College and others; and

WHEREAS, the livability of Santa Fe will be greatly enhanced with the completion of these bicycle trails and other bicycle improvements; and

WHEREAS, Resolution 1984-56 (Articles 1 and 2) requires that all committees, task forces and ad hoc committees be created by resolution; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF SANTA FE THAT:

- Section 1. The Council hereby establishes a Bicycle and Trail Advisory Committee.
- Section 2. A Bicycle and Trail Advisory Committee is established to serve in an advisory capacity.
- Section 3. NAME: The advisory committee shall be called the Bicycle and Trail Advisory Committee ("Committee").
- Section 4. PURPOSE: The Committee shall evaluate the 1993 Bicycle Master

 Plan and the trail portion of the Parks, Open Space; Trails & Recreation Master Plan and advise

 city staff on measures needed to expedite the plans' implementation.
- Section 5. DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITES: The Committee shall help prioritize the projects to be completed using CIP funds, review construction plans, review allocation of funds for improvements, seek funding through CIP, state or federal funds.
- Section 6. MEMBERSHIP: The Committee shall consist of a member of the City

 Council who shall also serves as its chair, along with eight members of the public, with

 recommendations from the city council to be made to the Mayor, and who will appoint the

 committee with a balance of recreational, commuter, biking, pedestrian, youth and neighborhood

 group users with the usual Council approval.
- Section 7. TIME: The members of the Committee shall have two year terms and shall serve at the pleasure of the governing body and may be removed at any time with or without cause.
- Section 8. MEETINGS: The Committee shall also conduct all meetings in accordance with adopted City policies and procedures and shall use Robert's Rules of Order in conducting its meetings. The shall meet at least every three months (quarterly) but may meet more often.
