

IMMIGRATION COMMITTEE

CREATING AUTHORITY: Adopted on January 16, 2002 by Resolution No. 2002-3. Amended by Resolution 2002-58 amending the members.

MEMBERS: The committee membership shall consist of nine representatives residing in the county of Santa Fe and selected from the following areas: human rights, social services, business community, health care, labor organizations, religious community, youth services providers, women's advocacy groups, educators and legal services.

TERMS: The members shall serve for a period of two years. The committee members shall serve at the pleasure of the mayor and may be removed at any time, with or without cause.

CHAIRPERSON: The members shall be appointed by the mayor with the approval of the governing body. The chairperson shall be appointed by the mayor and the vice-chairperson shall be designated by the committee.

STAFF LIAISON: The city manager shall designate the intercultural affairs planner or other city staff as staff liaison to the committee.

On January 13, 1999, the governing body adopted Resolution No. 1999-6 declaring a policy of non-discrimination on the basis of a person's national origin and appointing an immigration task force.

The Immigration Task Force established by Resolution No. 1999-6 is hereby renamed the "Immigration Committee".

The committee shall monitor the human rights status of non-citizens residing in the city of Santa Fe and report its findings and recommendations to the governing body.
