In the first few months of the program, the mixed recycling weights increased over 30%! Thank you Santa Fe! TIME SMART!

Make sure carts are at the curb by **7 am** on the DAY of service.



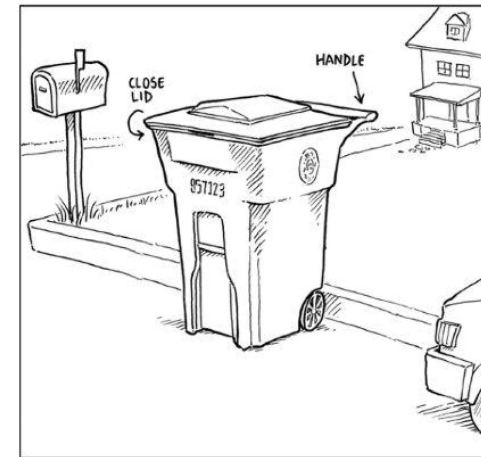
Carts can be placed out after **6 pm** the night BEFORE service.

Carts must be removed from the curb by **8 am** the morning AFTER service.



WHEEL SMART!

Place carts in the street on the curb with the wheels towards the curb



MATERIAL SMART!

Cardboard boxes should be cut down and placed top to bottom in cart to avoid service issues.

Household Hazardous Waste (HHW)

Be Cart Smart with home chemicals! Many products can become toxic or even explosive when mixed together in your cart, or on the trash collection truck. Properly dispose of these materials at the Household Hazardous Waste Center (HHW) located within the Buckman Road Recycling & Transfer Station (BuRRT).

The HHW is open Friday and Saturday from 8 am - 4:45 pm unless BuRRT is closed due to a posted holiday.

Common HHW Items:

- Gasoline, oil and oil filters
- Aerosol cans
- Rechargeable batteries, including cell and button batteries
- Propane tanks and cylinders (used for BBQ, camping, etc.)
- Household cleaners
- Paints, varnishes and stains
- Fire extinguishers
- Pesticides
- Pool chemicals
- Compact Fluorescent Light (CFL) bulbs
- Electronic items (computers, printers, televisions, etc.)*

*Electronic items can be dropped off daily at BuRRT, but the HHW is only open Friday and Saturday

NOT Accepted:

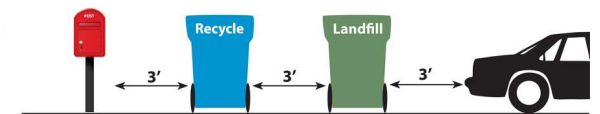
- PCBs
- Explosives
- Radioactive Waste
- Medical and Pharmaceutical Waste (see page 9 for disposal options)
- Alkaline batteries (these are safe to dispose in the trash)

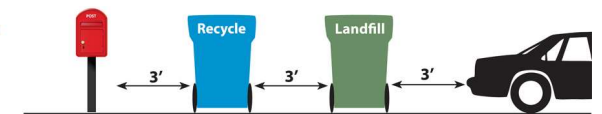

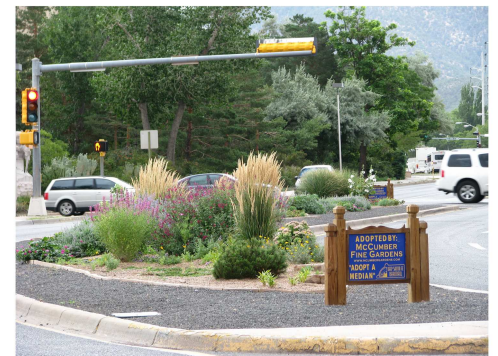

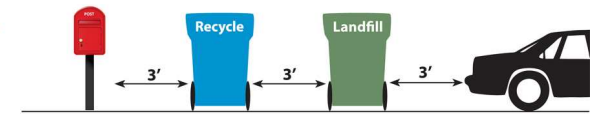
Helping to keep our Santa Fe beautiful has never been easier!

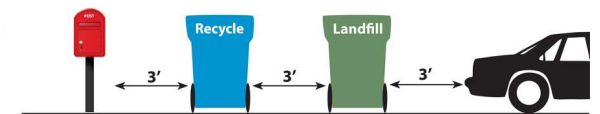

Cart Smart FAQs

Still not sure? Here are some more helpful hints:



Caps on? Or caps off?

Caps and bottles are **both** recyclable. Keep the caps on they will get processed. **NOTE:** Caps by themselves fall out of the automated MRF sort process so its bes to put them back on the container.

Do I need to rinse my items before recycling them?

It is recommended that you try and get as much food or liquid out of the container as possible. Tiny amounts are OK... don't go overboard with your cleaning.

Does the same truck pick up trash and recycling?

No, in Santa Fe blue trucks are used to collect recycling and white trucks are used to collect trash. Also, the recyclables are taken to the Buckman Road Recycling & Transfer Station (BuRRT) where they are consolidated and shipped to Albuquerque for processing. The trash goes to the Caja del Rio Landfill which is managed by SFSWMA.

Too big for your trash cart?

Environmental Services offers a 'large item' collection service for large items which can't be placed in your trash cart. Call (505) 955-2200 to schedule (fees apply.)

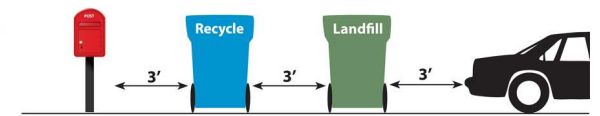
What to do with plastic bags?

While single use plastic bags have been banned in Santa Fe, there are still a LOT of bags that are in use. Plastic bags and plastic film can wrap around the automated equipment and shut down the MRF. Recycle your plastic bags and stretch wrap at local grocery stores rather than in the blue cart.



Pizza boxes, pizza boxes. What to do?

Empty pizza boxes are recyclable. Remove all crusts, paper and anything else that comes with your 'pie'. If the bottom is very greasy, tear off the clean parts and put in the recycle cart. The greasy parts should be thrown in the trash OR if you compost in your yard, add it to your compost pile/bin.

Manage Your Meds

Drugs and used needles (sharps) must be disposed of properly to protect both people and the environment.

Don't EVER flush unwanted medication down the toilet or drain and don't place them in your carts. Instead take them to a drug disposal kiosk. This is a safe way to dispose of prescription, non-prescription and pet medications. You can find a kiosk at one of these locations:

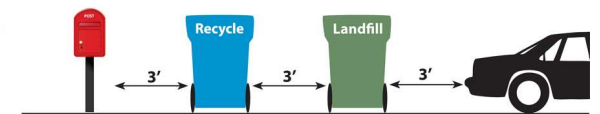

Used needles are not accepted at the Police or Fire Department. Limited quantities can be brought to Walgreens. Used needles in a sealed container (see below) *can be placed in the trash.*

Bring Your Own Bag (BYOB)

Plastic shopping bags easily become litter, enter waterways, and pose harm to wildlife. Plastic does not decompose; it photodegrades, which means it breaks down into small pieces in the presence of sunlight, and these can soak up toxins and make their way into food webs. Plastic bag litter is costly to clean up, and plastic bags are one worst sources of contamination for recycling, as the bags wrap around the machinery that sorts your materials.

The City of Santa Fe Bag Ordinance bans certain single-use plastic shopping bags, and imposes a ten cent fee for paper bags. The City's portion of this money is used to purchase reusable bags for residents, and for environmental education materials like this calendar!

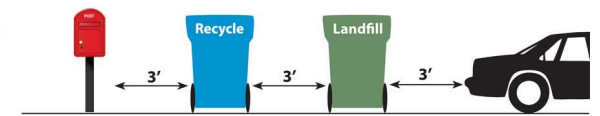

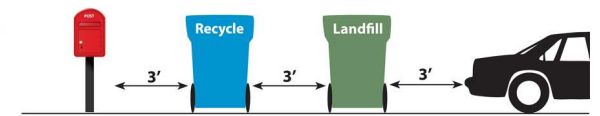

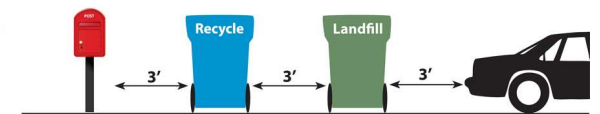

Reduce / Reuse / Recycle

Recycling is often the easiest way to conserve resources on the zero waste path, but it's not the first on the list!

Reduce:

Ask yourself, "Do I really need this?" If the answer is NO, then don't get it. Avoid disposable or single use items in favor of things that last longer.

Reuse:

If you do need something, research the item and invest in durable goods. Or consider buying used items instead. Santa Fe has a thriving reuse economy! Check out thrift shops and consignment stores for clothing, furniture, and materials for home improvement projects. Many of the stores benefit local charities too!

"Upcycling" is a popular form of reuse. The Recycle Santa Fe Art Festival showcases many ways that local artists have transformed trash into treasure. Pictures of past shows and information about upcoming events are available at www.recyclesantafe.org.

Recycle:

The recycling process breaks the item down into its raw components which are then manufactured into new items.



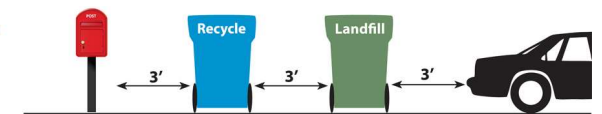

Shine On Santa Fe!

With holiday parties and presents abounding, the month of December provides even more opportunities for recycling.

Re-charge It!

Buy rechargeable batteries to power toys and tech gifts this year. Unlike alkaline batteries, these can be recharged and reused many times, and at the end of their life, they can be recycled.

Wrap It and Pack It Eco-Style

Wrapping paper is recyclable (as long as it isn't foil backed).

For shipping, replace foam or bubble wrap with recyclable newspaper, or with air-popped popcorn, which can be placed outside as a feast for winter birds.

After the holidays, remember to flatten boxes and place in your recycling cart or take to a Recycling Drop-off Center.

Oh Christmas Tree

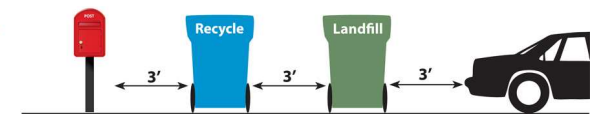

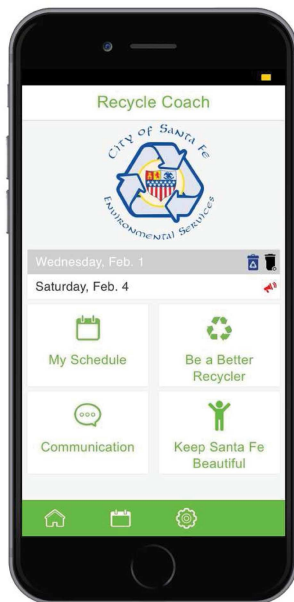
