## **Library Division Director**

## **Big Read**

Maria Tucker and Moira Gehring met with Cyndi Conn, Executive Director of Creative Santa Fe to discuss potential partnerships. Create Santa Fe sent out a survey through their Social Media channels to gauge the Santa Fe Community's interest in a book selection for a Big Read application. After much deliberation, the selection committee has decided to select "Into the Beautiful North" by Luis Alberto Urrea for a Big Read application. We will partner with the Literacy Volunteers of Santa Fe and develop multiple community partnerships. Moira Gehring is contacting Site Santa Fe and Edelma Huntley is contacting an author and the Museum of Folk Art. Maria Tucker will be work on the application with the committee's assistance.

#### DCA BUDGET HEARING

#### **NALSIG MEETING**

On December 13, over 30 attendees heard Regis Pecos present the results of four convocations of tribal leaders concerning the Yazzie Martinez public education lawsuit. He summarized the proposal to invest in the construction and support of tribal public libraries statewide. The legislation would be similar to last session's HB 659, which requested \$35 million for tribal library construction.

#### BILLS INTRODUCED

1. Study of the feasibility of creating a "New Mexico History Room" in a local library in each county.

AN ACT RELATING TO PUBLIC PROJECTS; ENACTING THE PUBLIC-PRIVATE PARTNERSHIP ACT; ALLOWING PUBLIC PARTNERS TO ENTER INTO PUBLIC-PRIVATE PARTNERSHIP AGREEMENTS TO FACILITATE PUBLIC PROJECTS; CREATING THE PUBLIC-PRIVATE PARTNERSHIP BOARD; CREATING THE PUBLIC-PRIVATE PARTNERSHIP PROJECT FUND; AUTHORIZING GRANTS, LOANS AND BONDS; PROVIDING POWERS AND DUTIES; REQUIRING REPORTS.

SECTION 14. Section 13-1-98 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1984, Chapter 65, Section 71, as amended by Laws 2019, Chapter 48, Section 13 and by Laws 2019, Chapter 63, Section 1) is amended to read:

"13-1-98. EXEMPTIONS FROM THE PROCUREMENT CODE.--The provisions of the Procurement Code shall not apply to:

E. purchases of books, periodicals and training materials in printed or electronic format from the publishers or copyright holders thereof and purchases of print, digital or electronic format library materials by public, school and state libraries for access by the public;
